RESOLUTION #03031593

Resolution to levy a severance tax on pulpwood in Lawrence County.

WHEREAS, the Lawrence County Board of Commissioners request the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee to pass the accompanying Private Act on pulpwood tax for Lawrence County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Lawrence County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session this 15th. day of March, 1993, approve resolution to levy a severance tax on pulpwood in Lawrence County.

AN ACT to levy a severance tax on  
pulpwood in Lawrence County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. As used in this act, unless the context otherwise  
requires:

(1) "County" means Lawrence County.

(2) "Person" means an individual, corporation,  
partnership, limited partnership, conglomerate, or any other  
entity owning or possessing an interest in lands located in the  
county.

(3) "Pulpwood" means trees severed from the ground, both  
hardwood and softwood, whether whole or part, that is ground or  
chipped and manufactured into salable wood or paper products.

SECTION 2.

(a) There is hereby levied a severance tax on all pulpwood  
products severed from the ground in the county. The tax is  
levied upon the entire production in the county regardless of  
the place of sale or the fact that delivery may be made outside  
the county.

(b) The tax accrues when such products are severed from  
the earth and in their natural or unprocessed state.

(c) The tax levied is a lien upon all such products  
severed in the county and upon all property from which it is  
severed, and such lien is entitled to preference over all  
judgments, encumbrances or liens whatsoever created.

SECTION 3. The measure of the tax is thirty cents (30¢) per  
ton on all pulpwood products severed from the ground in the county.

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extent of the owner's interest in such products. The owner becomes liable when the pulpwood products are severed from the earth and ready for sale, whether before processing or after processing as the case may be.

#### SECTION 5.

(a) The tax levied by this act is due, and payable monthly on the tenth day of the month next succeeding the month in which the pulpwood is severed from the soil.

(b) For the purpose of ascertaining the amount of tax payable, it is the duty of all owners to transmit to the county trustee, on or before the fifteenth day of the month next succeeding the month in which the tax accrues, a return upon forms provided by the county trustee. The return shall be accompanied by a remittance covering the amount of tax due as computed by the taxpayer.

#### SECTION 6.

(a) The tax levied by this act becomes delinquent on the sixteenth day of the month next succeeding the month in which such tax accrues.

(b) When any owner fails to make any return and pay the full amount of the tax levied on or before such date, there is imposed, in addition to other penalties provided herein, a specific penalty in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the tax due. A further penalty of fifty percent (50%) of the amount due may be added if the nonpayment of the tax is due to an intent to evade payment.

(c) All such penalties and interest imposed by this act are payable to and collectible by the county trustee in the same manner as if they were a part of the tax imposed.

SECTION 7. If the nonpayment of the tax is due to an intent to evade payment, the person liable for such payment may be restrained and enjoined from severing pulpwood from all production units administered, owned or possessed by that person in the county from

county by the sheriff upon the request of the county trustee.

SECTION 8. The proceeds of the tax levied by this act shall be deposited in the general fund of the county. All proceeds of the tax levied by this act shall be allocated solely to the Lawrence County Tomorrow Project Fund.

SECTION 9.

(a) It is a violation of this act for any person required by this act to make a return, pay a tax, keep records, or furnish information deemed necessary by the county trustee for the computation, assessment, or collection of the tax imposed by this act, to fail to make the return, pay the tax, keep the records, or furnish the information at the time required by law or regulation. It is a violation for any person to willfully or fraudulently make and sign a return which such person does not believe to be true and correct as to every material fact.

(b) A violation of the provisions of this act is punishable by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

(c) For purposes of this section the word "person" also includes an officer or employee of a corporation or a member or employee of a partnership who is under duty to perform the act in respect to which the violation occurs.

SECTION 10. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of Lawrence County. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the county legislative body and certified to the secretary of state.

SECTION 11. For the purposes of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. Upon approval as provided in Section 10, it shall become effective July 1, 1993, the public welfare requiring it.

RESOLUTION TO RECOMMEND TO THE LEGISLATURE OF  
THE STATE OF TENNESSEE THAT HORSE DRAWN VEHICLES  
BE EQUIPPED WITH CERTAIN MINIMUM LIGHTING REQUIREMENTS

WHEREAS, horse drawn vehicles operate on the public roads often create a safety hazard during night time hours in that such vehicles are not highly visible to motorists; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of Commissioners of Lawrence County, Tennessee, to encourage the legislature of the State of Tennessee to alleviate such road hazards.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Lawrence County, Tennessee, to recommend to the legislature of the State of Tennessee to enact certain minimum lighting requirements for horse drawn vehicles and would recommend such minimum requirements to be as follows:

1. That any person that will drive a horse drawn vehicle on Tennessee State or county roads must have reached the age of 14 years and have completed a course either in school or at a certified Tennessee License Examination Center on the Tennessee Drivers Handbook, upon completion of said course pass a test on the Tennessee Driver Handbook and be issued a certificate of completion or permit.

2. A horse drawn vehicle that is used for the transportation of people or of products from one point to another shall comply with the lighting requirements. Any implement that is used for a specific agriculture practice shall not be required to have the lighting requirements but such implement shall not be

on the roads of a county or State of Tennessee 30 minutes after sunset or 30 minutes before sunrise.


3. All horse drawn vehicles have a minimum of 400 square inches of reflective tape outlining the shape of the horse drawn vehicle from the lowest point to the highest point on the rear of the vehicle with a minimum of 100 square inches of said tape being red. Also 400 square inches of reflective tape on the front of horse drawn vehicles visible from the front for at least 500 feet and not obstructed by the horses pulling such vehicle.

4. A battery powered strobe light that is mounted to the highest most point of horse drawn vehicles or a minimum of 6 feet 8 inches from the ground as to be seen from front or rear and not obstructed from the front of the horse pulling such vehicle. Strobe light should be powered by a minimum of a 12 volt lantern battery that is in good working order. Strobe light itself should have a lens that is transparent in color and at least a 4" dome that generates sufficient light to be sent 1000 feet at night.

5. In all instances horse drawn vehicles be required to be to the furthest right of highway preferably on shoulder of highway. If horse drawn vehicles must be on highway itself before leaving right of way, horse drawn vehicle must stop and give an appropriate hand signal before mounting highway itself.

This Resolution shall take effect upon its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

The Lawrence County Safety Committee had a meeting 3-12-93 at 4:00 P. M. to discuss the problems of Horse Drawn Vehicles in Lawrence County not having sufficient lighting or safety equipment. Representative Calvin Moore was present along with County Executive Marty Dunkin, several concerned citizens and a group of Amish were also present.

The Amish were in objection to having a battery powered strobe light installed on their horse drawn vehicle, stating it is against their religious belief to have such things.

After questioning the Amish they stated they have used battery powered flash lights for as long as any of them could remember. Also they were asked about using a red reflective tape or the Slow Moving Emblem. They were again in opposition to this. After again questioning them they stated that they complained with the TWRA's code of wearing 500 square inches of blaze orange for the privilege of hunting in Tennessee.

It is the opinion of the Safety Committee that the requirement offered to Representative Moore are not in conflict to the Amish Religious Beliefs but are in fact practices that the Amish are using as of today in their every day lives and upon compliance of such requirement. The Amish community all horse drawn vehicles, and the motorist of Lawrence County will be safer.

Strobe light should be powered by a minimum of a ~~12~~<sup>LANTHE RAY</sup> volt battery that is in good working order. Strobe light itself should have a lens that is transparent in color and at least a 4" dome that generate sufficient light to be sent 1000 ft at night.
5. In all instances horse drawn vehicles be required to be to the furthest right of highway preferably on shoulder of highway. If horse drawn vehicle must be on highway itself before leaving right of way. Horse Drawn vehicle must stop and give an appropriate hand signal before mounting highway itself.

Lawrence County, Tennessee

Gentlemen:

The City of Lawrenceburg (the "City"), the Industrial Development Board of the City of Lawrenceburg (the "Board"), and Lawrence County, Tennessee (the "County") understand Southwestern Ohio Steel, L.P. ("SOS") is considering an expansion project (the "Expansion") of its manufacturing facility located here in Lawrenceburg, Lawrence County, Tennessee, which Expansion will approximately double the size of the present facility and create approximately 20 new employees at the SOS manufacturing facility in Lawrenceburg. It is also our understanding that as a condition precedent of making this Expansion, SOS is desirous of having rail service to its plant facility. The City and County are agreeable to making certain substantial and material inducements to assist SOS with the expense and economic feasibility of such Expansion. Likewise, the City and County are agreeable to assist in making available the necessary rights-of-way and site preparation for Tennessee Southern Railroad Company, Inc. (the "Railroad") to construct a spur track to the SOS facility.

In order for the City and County to move forward with the necessary acquisitions of land, rights-of-way and applications for grants from the State of Tennessee, we would appreciate your confirmation of the Expansion SOS will make and a confirmation of the economic inducements the City and County are offering in order to locate the Expansion in Lawrenceburg, Lawrence County, Tennessee. We are taking the liberty of setting forth our understanding of the obligations of SOS, the Railroad, and the City and County to induce the Expansion.

Railroad Spur Track

The City and County will contribute a combined total of \$10,000.00 cash for the acquisition of the necessary right-of-way to construct a railroad spur track from the main line of the railroad to the SOS property line, according to the general plan as set forth in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto. The City and County have had the aforesaid right-of-way appraised by a licensed Tennessee Real Estate Appraiser, which appraisal states that said right-of-way and any incidental damages thereto is valued at \$13,500.00. SOS will be responsible for the cost of said right-of-way over and above \$10,000.00. The City, County and Railroad will share in the cost of construction of said spur track by in-kind and/or cash payments according to the estimate from Crouch Engineering, P.C. which is attached hereto as Exhibit B. Provided, however, all of the

parties hereto are aware that the County has made application through the Tennessee Industrial Infrastructure Program as administered by the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development for a grant of approximately \$195,000.00, and this agreement is contingent upon the approval of said grant from said Department of Economic and Community Development.

SOS will be responsible for the cost of said spur track from the point the railroad right-of-way joins the present SOS property line.

#### Expansion of Existing Building

SOS shall, at its sole cost and expense, construct a building of approximately 57,000 square feet to accommodate the Expansion.

#### Land and Improvements Lease

Upon completion of construction of the building which is contemplated herein in conformity with the applicable codes, zoning and governmental regulations, SOS shall take possession of the property pursuant to the terms of a lease between SOS and the Board (the "Lease"). The Lease shall provide for a term of ten (10) years, commencing the date of SOS acceptance of the completed improvements. Monthly rental payments under the lease shall be equal to the installments of principal and interest payable under the industrial development bonds or notes to be issued by the Board to finance the aforesaid costs.

#### Machinery and Equipment Lease

SOS may, at its option, convey or cause to be conveyed to the Board industrial machinery or equipment to be installed in the Expansion or presently located in the SOS manufacturing facility (the "Equipment"). The Board will, upon request of SOS, issue to a purchaser or purchasers identified by SOS industrial development bonds or notes in one or more series to finance acquisition of the Equipment. Such Equipment shall be leased by the Board to SOS pursuant to a lease (the "Equipment Lease") containing terms and conditions reasonably satisfactory to SOS; provided, however, that lease payments thereunder shall at all times be adequate to pay debt service on any industrial development bonds or notes issued by the Board to finance its acquisition of such Equipment. The Equipment Lease shall commence on the same date as the lease commences, and shall be for a term of the same duration as the lease.

#### Industrial Development Bonds

At the request of SOS, the Board will issue such industrial development bonds and/or notes as may be necessary or convenient in order to finance the construction of the Expansion as hereinabove provided and the acquisition of the Equipment to be used by SOS in its manufacturing process. It is anticipated that the

bonds and/or notes issued to finance the cost of the construction of the improvements as hereinabove provided will be secured by an assignment of the lease and a deed of trust lien on the land and the improvements. It is also anticipated that the bonds and/or notes issued to finance the cost of the acquisition of Equipment will be secured by a security interest in the Equipment and/or an assignment of the Equipment Lease. SOS will be responsible for obtaining one or more purchasers for the bonds and/or notes to be issued by the Board to finance the construction of the improvements and the acquisition of the Equipment.

In-Lieu-of-Tax Agreement

Pursuant to taxation provisions governing the issuance of industrial revenue bonds and/or notes, both the City and County shall grant a moratorium on all real and personal property taxes otherwise assessed on real and personal property to be used by SOS in its manufacturing facility in Lawrenceburg, Lawrence County, Tennessee, which is owned by the Board and leased to SOS. This moratorium shall be for a period of five years after any industrial development bond is issued. After the initial five year period, "payments-in-lieu-of-tax" as it relates to these taxes, shall not exceed the following schedule.

- (a) In Year 6 - 20% of the amount that would be due;
- (b) In Year 7 - 40% of the amount that would be due;
- (c) In Year 8 - 60% of the amount that would be due;
- (d) In Year 9 - 80% of the amount that would be due;
- (e) In Year 10 - 100% of the amount that would be due;

The aforesaid tax schedule shall be inclusive of both City and County tax, i.e. for Lawrence County, Tennessee, as well as the City of Lawrenceburg.

In-lieu-of-tax payments for any year shall be due and payable to the City and the County on or before the last day of February of the next succeeding year.

This in-lieu-of-tax agreement is contingent upon the approval of such agreement by the appropriate state agencies and upon all steps being taken to make this agreement legally enforceable, including, but not limited to, the issuance of industrial development bonds by the Board.

The City and County are looking forward to working with SOS as we are all making a substantial investment in our community by providing a facility that will assist and improve the overall economic status of Lawrence County, the City of Lawrenceburg, and the surrounding communities by this substantial investment.

We would appreciate your execution and acknowledgement of this letter and returning of the same in order for the City and County to move forward with its obligations.

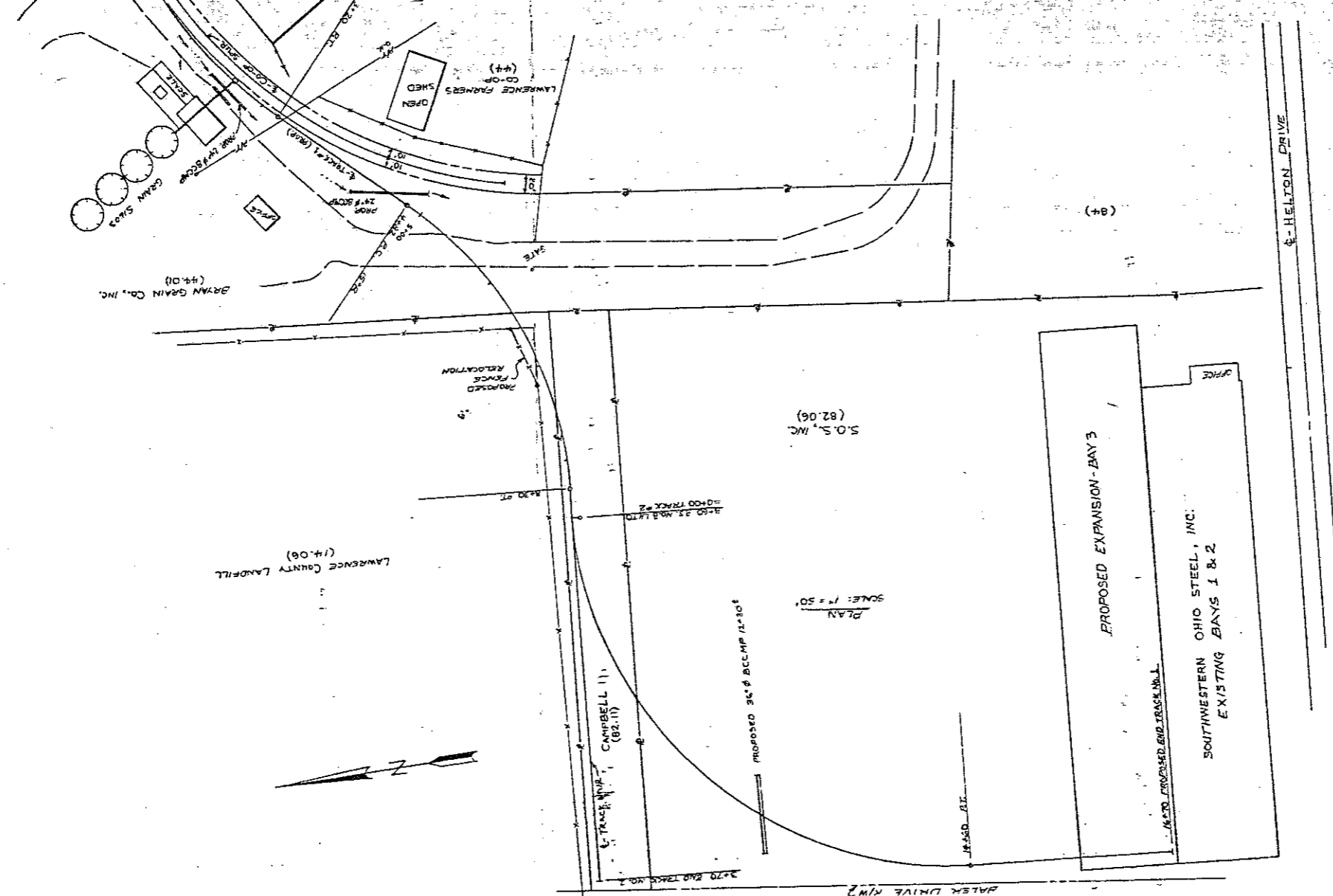
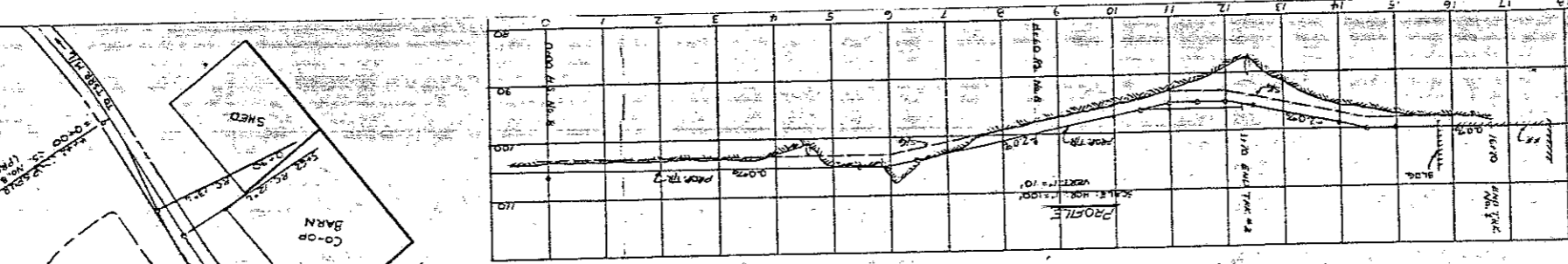

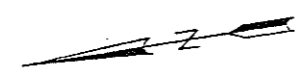

## ENGINEERING REPORT

### PROPOSED RAIL SERVICE FOR SOUTHWESTERN OHIO STEEL, INC.

Southwestern Ohio Steel, Inc. (SOS) plans to expand its facilities in Lawrenceburg, Tennessee, constructing a new building, overhead crane, and manufacturing process line to handle 80,000 lb (40 TN) coils of rolled sheet steel. The 40 TN coils can only be shipped by rail car. In order to insure the plant expansion, rail service must be provided for the new facility.

The SOS site is located along Helton Drive and Baler Road, in close proximity to U.S. Highway 43, and the Tennessee Southern Railroad main line in Lawrenceburg, Tennessee. In order to provide the transportation infrastructure required for the shipment of raw materials to the plant, it is necessary to construct a railroad spur track running west into the SOS plant from the existing Co-op Spur, located on the Tennessee Southern Railroad main line.

The proposed track would cross the Bryan Grain Co. access road. A second spur, to be used for setting off and holding loaded cars, will be constructed west of the Bryan access road. The second spur is required to allow switching, by the industry, of the anticipated 6 cars per delivery.

In order to provide the rail service required by the industry, State assistance through the Tennessee Industrial Infrastructure Program is needed.

The proposed track layout consists of a new spur track (Track No. 1) leaving the Co-op Spur at Station 4+42 (0+00 Track No. 1), turning out to the west using a new No. 8 Right Hand turnout. The spur track will run parallel to the Co-op Spur for a few hundred feet, then cross the Bryan Grain Co. access road, then run parallel to the SOS property line before entering the manufacturing building (Station 16+70).

A second spur track (Track No. 2) will leave Track No. 1 with a No. 8 Turnout at Station 8+60, Track No. 1, running west, parallel with the northern property line, and will end at Sta. 3+70 (Track No. 2), near Baler Road.

A cost estimate for the grading, drainage and track construction for the proposed railroad service at SOS is attached.

A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE LAWRENCE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, TO OBTAIN PROPERTY FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A RAILROAD SPUR TRACT OR FOR OTHER RAILROAD RIGHT OF WAY PURPOSES, AUTHORITY, AUTHORIZATION FOR CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS, APPROPRIATION, DETERMINATION OF PUBLIC PURPOSE, EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Lawrence County, Tennessee, has entered into an agreement with Southwestern Ohio Steel, L.P. in Lawrence County, among others concerning SOS Expansion Project in Lawrenceburg, and

WHEREAS, under the terms and conditions of said agreement, the City of Lawrenceburg and Lawrence County have contracted to acquire necessary right-of-way for construction of a railroad spur track from Tennessee Southern Railroad's main line to SOS Expansion Project, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lawrenceburg and Lawrence County, under the various statutes of the State of Tennessee have the authority to eminent domain in order to obtain the right-of-way, and

WHEREAS, an integral part of the SOS expansion is the requirement for obtaining the railroad spur line, and

WHEREAS, Lawrence County has determined that the property to be acquired for the railroad spur line is to be taken for public use and is in the public interest, and

WHEREAS, the property to be acquired for the railroad spur line is more particularly described on the attached Exhibit "A".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS LAWRENCE COUNTY, TENNESSEE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Lawrence County is authorized to obtain the property more particularly described on the attached Exhibit "A" for railroad right-of-way purposes for the construction of a spur track from the existing Tennessee Southern Railroad line to the edge of the Southwestern Ohio Steel, L.P. property. In the event the property cannot be obtained by a private negotiated sale, the property may be obtained through eminent domain proceedings.

2. AUTHORITY.

Lawrence County has the authority to exercise eminent domain in obtaining the property more particularly described on the attached Exhibit "A" through the various

statutes of the State of Tennessee, including but not limited to Tennessee Code Annotated, §29-17-201, Tennessee Code Annotated, §29-17-801(a) and Tennessee Code Annotated, §7-53-310 et. seq.

3. PUBLIC USE AND PUBLIC INTERESTS.

The Board of county Commissioners of Lawrence County make the specific determination that obtaining the property more particularly described on the attached Exhibit "A" is for a specified public use and in the public interest in that the railroad spur will have a definite and fixed use in the public interest will be for the economic development of the City of Lawrenceburg and Lawrence County, Tennessee.

4. APPROPRIATION.

The Board of county Commissioners does hereby appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be applied toward the acquisition costs of the property.

The Board of County Commissioners does hereby engage in the services of Charles W. Holt, Jr., county Attorney, to proceed to obtain the property.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

## Legal Description

### Construction Easement and Right-of-Way

for the Construction of a Railroad Lead Track to Serve

Southwestern Ohio Steel, Inc.

Lawrence County, Tennessee

The property described herein consists of two items, the one being a construction easement required for the construction of a railroad lead track to serve Southwestern Ohio Steel, Inc., (SOS) the other being a permanent right-of-way held by Lawrence County, Tennessee.

### Construction Easement

A Construction Easement shall be used by Lawrence County, Tennessee and any third parties contracted to perform work necessary to complete a railroad lead track, and any necessary appurtenances required for construction of said railroad track, beginning at a proposed point of switch for the lead track at Station 4+42 on the 'Co-Op Spur Track' (442' down the center line of the 'Co-Op Spur Track' from the point of switch on the Tennessee Southern Railroad main line track), across the Bryan Grain Co., Inc. property, to the existing property boundary between the Lawrence County Landfill and Bryan Grain Co., Inc. The width of said construction easement shall be twenty-five feet (25') on the north side of the proposed railroad centerline, and twenty-five feet (25') on the south side of the proposed centerline, joining the Co-Op Spur Track right-of-way, being a line running parallel to the Co-Op Spur Track. The Construction Easement shall be relinquished upon final completion of the project. The area contained in the Construction Easement is 0.57 acres.

### Right-of-Way

A permanent Right-of-Way Easement shall be maintained by Lawrence County, Tennessee, for the purpose of maintaining and operating a railroad lead track, beginning at a point of switch at Station 4+42 on the 'Co-Op Spur Track' (442' down the center line of the 'Co-Op Spur Track' from the point of switch on the Tennessee Southern Railroad main line track), across the Bryan Grain Co., Inc. property, to the existing property boundary between the Lawrence County Landfill and Bryan Grain Co., Inc. The width of said construction easement shall be ten feet (10') on the north side of the proposed railroad centerline, and ten feet (10') on the south side of the proposed centerline, joining the Co-op Spur Track right-of-way, being a line running parallel to the Co-Op Spur Track 10' north of the centerline of the Co-Op Spur Track. The area contained in the permanent right-of-way is 0.24 acres.



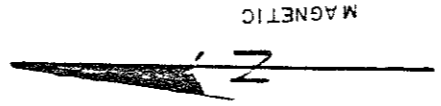
