

WHEREAS, due to the fact that said Superintendent and Board of Education supervise and control the operation and maintenance of said school buildings and educational facilities, the Lawrence County Commission is of the opinion that compliance with all regulations of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) should be removed from the office of County Executive of Lawrence County, Tennessee, and placed directly with the office of the Lawrence County Superintendent of Education and Lawrence County Board of Education.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Lawrence County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on the 23rd day of November, 1999, as follows:

1. That the responsibilities of compliance with the regulations and guidelines of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) pertaining to the school buildings and educational facilities of Lawrence County, Tennessee, be and the same are hereby removed from the office of County Executive of Lawrence County, Tennessee and placed directly with the office of the Superintendent of Education and the Board of Education of Lawrence County,

Tennessee.

2. That this Resolution be effective immediately upon its passage as required by law, the public welfare of Lawrence County requiring it.

**TENNESSEE OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY
AND HEALTH PROGRAM PLAN**

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Revised December, 1999

I. **PURPOSE AND COVERAGE**

The purpose of this plan is to provide guidelines and procedures for implementing the Lawrence County Occupational Safety and Health Program for its employees, part-time or full-time.

Lawrence County, in electing to establish and maintain an effective occupational safety And health program for its employees, shall:

- (1) Provide a safe and healthful place and condition of employment.
- (2) Require the use of safety equipment, personal protective equipment and devices, where reasonably necessary to protect employees.
- (3) Make, keep, preserve, and make available to the State Commissioner of Labor, his designated representative or persons within the agency to whom such responsibilities have been delegated, including the Director of the Office of Occupational Safety and Health, adequate records of all occupational accidents and personal injuries for proper evaluation and necessary corrective action as required.
- (4) Consult with the State Commissioner of Labor, or his designated representative, with regard to the adequacy of the form and content of records.
- (5) Consult with the State Commissioner of Labor or the State Commissioner of Public Health, as appropriate, regarding safety and health problems of Lawrence County, which are considered to be unusual or peculiar to the County, and are such that they cannot be achieved under a standard promulgated by the State.
- (6) Make an annual report to the State Commissioner of Labor with respect to accidents and personal injuries and to show accomplishments and progress of the total occupational, safety and health program.
- (7) Provide reasonable opportunity for the participation of employees in the effectuation of the objectives of this program, including the opportunity to make anonymous complaints concerning conditions or practices injurious to employee safety and health.

II. **DEFINITIONS**

For the purpose of this program:

- (1) "Commissioner of Labor" means the chief executive officer of Tennessee Department of Labor. This includes any person appointed, designated, or deputized to perform the duties or to exercise the powers assigned to the Commissioner of Labor.
- (2) "Commissioner of Public Health" means the chief executive officer of the Tennessee Department of Public Health. This includes any person appointed, designated, or deputized to perform the duties or to exercise the powers assigned to the Commissioner of Public Health.

- (3) "Employer" means Lawrence County, and shall include each administrative department, commission, board, division, or other agency of the County.
- (4) "Director of Safety and Health" means the chief executive officer designated by the County to perform duties or to exercise powers assigned so as to plan, develop, and administer the County's Safety and Health Program.
- (5) "Compliance Inspector(s)" means the individual(s) appointed and designated by the Director to conduct inspections provided for herein. If no compliance inspector(s) is appointed, the Director shall conduct the inspections.
- (6) "Appointing Authority" means the County Judge or group of County officials having legally designated powers of appointment, employment, or removal for a specific department, commission, board, division or other agency of the County.
- (7) "Employee" means any person performing services for the County and listed on County payrolls either as part-time, seasonal, or permanent, full-time employees; provided, however, that such definition shall not include independent contractors, their agents, servants, and employees.
- (8) "Person" means one or more individuals, partnerships, associations, corporations, business trusts, legal representatives or any organized group of persons.
- (9) "Standard" means an occupational safety and health standard promulgated by the Tennessee State Commissioner of Labor or the State Commissioner of Public Health which requires conditions or the adoption or the use of one or more practices, means, methods, operations or processes reasonably necessary or appropriate to provide safe and healthful employment and places of employment.
- (10) "Imminent Danger" means any conditions or practices in any place of employment which are such that a danger exists which could reasonably be expected to cause death or serious physical harm immediately or before the imminence of such danger can be eliminated through normal enforcement procedures; provided, however, that this definition shall not include hazardous operations which are undertaken for the public's safety and well-being.
- (11) "Serious Physical Harm" means that type of harm that would cause permanent or prolonged impairment of the body in that (a) a part of the body would be permanently removed (e.g. amputation of an arm, leg, finger; loss of an eye) or rendered functionally useless or substantially reduced in efficiency on or off the job (e.g. leg shattered so severely that mobility would be permanently reduced) or (b) a part of an internal bodily system would be inhibited in its normal performance to such a degree as to shorten life or cause reduction in physical or mental efficiency (e.g. lung impairment, causing shortness of breath). On the other hand, breaks, cuts, bruises, concussions, or similar injuries would not fit either of these categories and would not constitute serious physical harm.
- (12) "Establishment" or workplace means a single physical location where business is conducted or where services or operations are performed.

III.

ADMINISTRATION

- A. The Director of Safety is designated as the chief executive officer to perform duties or to exercise powers assigned so as to administer the Lawrence County Occupational Safety and Health Program.
1. The Director of Safety may designate person, or persons, as he deems necessary to carry out his powers, duties, and responsibilities under the Program.
 2. The Director of Safety shall employ measures to coordinate to the extent possible and activities of all departments to promote efficiency and to minimize any inconveniences under the Program.
 3. The Director of Safety may delegate the power to make inspections, provided procedures employed are as effective as those employed by the Director.
 4. The Director of Safety may request qualified technical personnel from any section of government to make or assist in making compliance inspections or investigations of a workplace as needed.
 5. The Director of Safety shall prepare an annual report to the Commissioner of Labor to show the accomplishments and progress of the County Occupational Safety and Health Program.
- B. The administrative head of each County department, division, or agency is responsible for implementing the Safety and Health Program for the employees in the County.
1. The administrative head shall follow the directions of the Director on issues involving Occupational Safety and Health of its employees as set forth in this plan.
 2. The administrative head shall comply with all abatement orders or request a review of the abatement order with the Director of Safety as set forth in this plan.
 3. The administrative head should make periodic safety surveys of the establishment under his jurisdiction to become aware of hazards that exist and make an attempt to immediately correct the observed hazards.
- C. Responsibilities of the Director of Safety
1. Make periodic and follow-up inspections of all the establishments where county employees are employed, make recommendations to correct any hazards or exposures observed, and make inspections as a result of complaints submitted by employees.
 2. Assist the administrative head in the investigation of the accident or illness.
 3. Upon receipt of the "First Report of Injury" (TOSHA Form 100), he is to determine probable cause and verify information contained in the report for accuracy.

4. Enter the occurrence in the "Log of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses," TOSHA Form #100 PS in the manner prescribed on the form and in accordance with record-keeping regulations as required by the Tennessee Department of Labor.
5. Submit periodic reports required by the Tennessee Department of Labor:
 - a. Within thirty (30) days after the end of the calendar year, a summary report must be forwarded to the Commissioner of the Department of Labor. This report will also be posted in each establishment in accordance with record-keeping regulations as required by the Tennessee Department of Labor.
 - b. Within eight hours after the death of any employee from a work-related incident or the hospitalization of three or more employees as a result of a work-related incident, the employer of any employee(s) so affected shall orally report the fatality/multiple hospitalizations by telephone or in person to the area office of the Occupational Safety & Health Administration (OSHA), U.S. Dept. of Labor, that is nearest to the site of the incident, or by using the OSHA toll-free central telephone number (615) 741-2793.
 - c. This requirement applies to each such fatality, or hospitalization of three or more employees, which occurs within (30) days of an incident.
 - d. Exception: If the employer does not learn of a reportable incident at the time it occurs and the incident would otherwise be reportable under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this section, the employer shall make the report within 8 hours of the time the incident is reported to any agent or employee of the employer.
 - e. Each report required by this section shall relate the following information: Establishment Name, Location of Incident, Time of the Incident, Number of Fatalities or Hospitalized Employees, Contact Person, Phone Number, and a Brief Description of the Incident.

IV. EMPLOYER'S RIGHTS AND DUTIES

Rights and duties of the employer shall include, but are not limited to the following provisions:

1. Employer shall furnish to each of his employees conditions of employment and a place of employment free from known and recognized hazards that are causing or are likely to cause death or serious injury or harm to employees.
2. Employer shall comply with occupational safety and health standards or regulations promulgated pursuant to the State Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1972.
3. Employer shall assist the State Commissioner of Labor and State Commissioner of Public Health, in the performance of their inspection duties by supplying necessary information to the Commissioners or to their respective assistants or deputies.
4. Employer is entitled to participate in the development of standards by submission of comments on proposed standards, participation in hearings on proposed standard, or by requesting the development of standards on a given issue.
5. Employer is entitled to request an order granting a variance from an Occupational Safety and Health Standard.

6. Employer is entitled to protection of its legally privileged communications.
7. Employer shall inspect all offices to insure the provisions of this program are complied with and carried out.
8. Employer shall notify and inform any employee; who has been, or is being, exposed in a biologically significant manner to harmful agents or material in excess of the applicable standard, of corrective action being taken by the County.
9. Employer shall notify and inform all County employees of their rights and duties under the Occupational Safety and Health Program.

V. **EMPLOYEE'S RIGHTS AND DUTIES**

Rights and duties of employees shall include, but are not limited to, the following provisions:

1. Each employee shall comply with occupational safety and health standards and all rules, regulations, and orders issued pursuant to this program which are applicable to his or her own actions and conduct.
2. Each employee shall be notified by the placing upon bulletin boards, or other places of common passage, of any application for a temporary order granting a variance from any standard or regulation.
3. Each employee shall be given the opportunity to participate in any hearing, which concerns an application for a variance from a standard.
4. Any employee who may be adversely affected by a standard or variance issued pursuant to this program may file a petition with the Director of Safety.
5. Any employee who has been exposed, or is being exposed, to toxic materials or harmful physical agents in concentrations or at levels in excess of that provided for an applicable standard shall be notified by the employer and informed of such exposure and the corrective action being taken.
6. Subject to regulations issued pursuant to this program, any employee or authorized representative of employees shall be given the right to request an inspection.
7. No employee shall be discharged or discriminated against because such employee has filed any complaint or instituted or caused to be instituted any proceedings or inspection under or relating to this program.
8. Any employee who believes that he or she has been discriminated against or discharged in violation of any of these sections may file a complaint with the Director of Safety. The employee will also have the right to file a complaint with the Commissioner of Labor alleging such discrimination.
9. Nothing in this section or any other provisions of this program shall be deemed to authorize or require medical examination, immunization, or treatment for those who object thereto on religious grounds, except where such is necessary for the protection of the health or safety of others, and except when such medical examination is reasonably required for performance of a specified job.

VI. EDUCATION AND TRAINING

A. Compliance Inspector

1. The County will arrange for the Director of Safety and/or designated compliance staff to attend training seminars, workshops, etc. conducted by the State of Tennessee or other state agencies.
2. The County will furnish reference materials, manuals, etc. deemed necessary to use in making compliance inspections, writing technical reports, and assuring top management and other employees that hazards do exist.

B. All Employees

The County shall establish a suitable safety and health-training program designed to:

1. Instruct each employee in the recognition and avoidance of unsafe conditions and regulations applicable to his work environment to control or eliminate any hazards or other exposures to illness or injury.
2. Instruct employees who are required to handle poisons, caustics, and other harmful substances, the safe handling and use, and make them aware of the potential hazards, personal hygiene, and personal protective measures required.
3. Instruct employees who may be exposed to environments where harmful plants or animals are present, the dangers of the environment, how to avoid injury and the first aid procedures to be used in the event of injury.
4. Instruct employees required to handle or use flammable liquids, gases, or toxic materials in the safe handling and use of these materials and made aware of specific requirements contained in Subparts H, M, and other applicable subparts of OSHA standards (29 CFR 1910 et. seq.)
5. Instruct all employees required to enter into confined or enclosed spaces as to the nature of the hazards involved, the necessary precautions to be taken, and in use of protective and emergency equipment required. The County shall comply with all specific regulations that apply to work in dangerous or potentially dangerous areas.
 - a. For purposes of (5) above, "confined or enclosed space" means any space having a limited means of egress, which is subject to the accumulation of toxic or flammable contaminants or has an oxygen deficient atmosphere. Confined or enclosed spaces include, but are not limited to, storage tanks, boilers, ventilation or exhaust ducts, sewers, underground utility, tunnels, pipelines, and open top spaces more than four (4) feet in depth such as pits, tubs, vaults, and vessels.
 - b. The Director of Safety is responsible for requiring the wearing of appropriate personal protective equipment in all operations where there is an exposure to hazardous conditions.

VII. STANDARDS AUTHORIZED

The standards adopted by the County are the applicable State of Tennessee Safety and Health standards developed under Section 6 of the State Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1972.

VIII. VARIANCE PROCEDURE

The Director of Safety may apply for a variance as a result of a complaint from an employee or of his knowing of certain exposures or hazards. The Director of Safety should definitely believe that a variance is needed before the application for a variance is submitted to the Commissioner of Labor or Commissioner of Health.

The procedure for applying for a variance to the adopted safety and health standards as outlined in the State Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1972 is as follows:

1. Either the Commissioner of Labor or the Commissioner of Public Health may upon written application by the County issue an order granting to the County a temporary variance from standards promulgated by such Commissioner under this Act. Any such order shall prescribe the practices, means, methods, operations, and processes, which the County must adopt or use while the variance is in effect and state in detail a program for coming into compliance with the standard.
2. Such a temporary variance may be granted only after notice to employees and interested parties and opportunity for hearing. The variance may be for a period of no longer than required to achieve compliance or one year, whichever is shorter. It may be renewed only once; provided, however, that in the case of employers undertaking experimental programs in safety and health, either programs in cooperation with state or federal agencies or private programs approved by either Commissioner, longer variances may be granted. Application for renewal of a variance must be filed in accordance with provisions in the initial grant of the variance.
3. An order granting a variance shall be issued only if the County establishes:
 - (a) (i) That it is unable to comply with the standard by the effective date because of unavailability of professional or technical personnel or materials and equipment required or necessary construction or alteration of facilities or technology, (ii) that all available steps have been taken to safeguard the County's employees against the hazards covered by the standard as quickly as practicable; or
 - (b) That the County is engaged in an experimental program as described in paragraph 2 of this section.
4. An application for a temporary variance shall contain:
 - (a) A specification of the standard or portion thereof from which the employer seeks a variance.
 - (b) A detailed statement of the reasons why the County is unable to comply with the standard supported by representatives by qualified personnel having first-hand knowledge of the facts represented.
 - (c) A statement of the steps the County has taken and will take (with specific dates) to protect employees against the hazard covered by the standard.
 - (d) A statement of when the County expects to comply and what steps the County has or will take (with dates specified) to come into compliance with the standard.

(e) A certification that the County informed its employees of the application by giving a copy of it to their authorized representatives, posting a statement summarizing the application (to include the location of a copy available for examination) at the places where employee notices are normally posted and by other appropriate means. The certification shall contain a description of the means actually employed to inform employees and that employees have been informed of their right to petition the Commissioner for a hearing.

5. Upon receipt of an application for an order granting a variance, the Commissioner to whom such application is addressed may issue an interim order granting such a variance, for the purpose of permitting time for an orderly consideration of such application. No such interim order may be effective for longer than one hundred and eighty (180) days.

VII.

IMMINENT DANGER PROCEDURES

A. Any allegation of imminent danger received shall be handled in accordance with the following procedures:

1. The Director of Safety shall immediately ascertain whether there is a reasonable basis for the complaint.
2. If the imminent danger complaint appears to have merit, the Director of Safety shall cause an immediate inspection of the alleged imminent danger location.
 - a. In an inspection conducted because of an alleged imminent danger, the imminent danger situation shall be inspected first.
 - b. Any other inspection activity should take place only after the imminent danger situation has been resolved.
3. As soon as it is concluded from such inspection that conditions or practices exist which constitute an imminent danger, the Director of Safety or the Compliance Inspector shall attempt to have the danger corrected through voluntary compliance. If any employees appear to be in immediate danger, they should be informed of the danger, and the supervisory personnel in charge should be requested to remove them from the area of immediate danger.
4. The administrative head of the workplace or his authorized representative is responsible for determining the manner in which he will abate the dangerous condition.
5. The imminent danger shall be deemed abated if the imminence of the danger has been eliminated by removing the employees from the area of danger of the conditions or practices which resulted in the imminent danger.
6. A written report shall be made to the Director of Safety describing in detail the imminent danger and its abatement.

B. Refusal to abate

The Director of Safety shall take whatever steps are necessary to achieve abatement.

X. INSPECTION PROCEDURES

- A. In order to carry out the purposes of this program, the Director of Safety or, if one is appointed, the Compliance Inspector is authorized to:
1. Enter, at any reasonable time, any establishment, or other area, work place, or environment where work is performed by an employee of the County, and;
 2. Inspect and investigate during regular working hours and at other reasonable times, and within reasonable limits and in a reasonable manner, any such place of employment and all pertinent conditions, processes, structures, machines, apparatus, devices, equipment, and materials therein, and to question privately any agent or employee working therein.
- B. If an imminent danger situation is alleged or brought to the attention of the Director of Safety or a Compliance Inspector during a routine inspection, he shall immediately inspect the imminent danger situation before inspecting the remaining portions of the workplace.
- C. An administrative representative of the County and a representative of the County and a representative authorized by the employees shall be given an opportunity to consult with or accompany the Compliance Inspector or Director during the physical inspection of any workplace for the purpose of aiding such inspection.
- D. The right of accompaniment may be denied any person whose conduct interferes with a full and orderly inspection.
- E. The inspection shall be such as to preclude unreasonable disruptions of the operations of the workplace or establishment.
- F. Interviews of employees during the course of the inspection, when accompanied by an employee representative, may be made when such interviews are essential to the investigative techniques.
- G. Advance Notice of Inspections:
1. Generally inspections are conducted without advance notice of inspection. This avoids giving personnel the opportunity to make minor or temporary adjustments in an attempt to create a misleading impression of conditions in an establishment.
 2. On the other hand, there may be occasions where notice is necessary to conduct an effective investigation. When advance notice of inspection is given, such notice shall also be given to the authorized representative of employees.
- H. The schedule of worksite inspections will be at the discretion of each of the department heads. The responsibility of the department heads will be to make daily observations and then make one (or more if needed) monthly inspection(s) on sites that are not in full compliance with Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health Act standards. The Director of Safety will be responsible for all inspections.

XI. EMPLOYEE COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

If any employee feels that he is assigned to work in conditions, now or at a time in the future, which might affect his health, safety, or general welfare, he should report the condition to the Director of Safety and Health. The complaint should be in the form of a letter. Upon receipt of the complaint, the Director of Safety will take necessary steps to evaluate the condition. The employee's complaint will be answered by a memo as soon as practical within 10 working days from the time the complaint was filed, as to what action or steps will be taken and a designated time period for correction. If the employee finds the correction or time period not to his satisfaction, he may then forward a letter to the County Executive explaining conditions and procedures taken.

The County Executive, upon receipt of the letter, will at that time begin to take steps to insure the improvement or removal of the condition. This will be accomplished through arbitration or administration sanctions. The employee's complaint will be answered by letter, within 10 working days, explaining the decisions made regarding the complaint. After the above steps have been followed and the employee is still not satisfied with the results, he may then forward a complaint to the Commissioner of Labor or to the Commissioner of Public Health.

Copies of all complaints and answers to complaints will be filed in a central location by date, to be forwarded to or reviewed by the Department of Labor upon request of same.

XII. ORDER OF ABATEMENT

A. If, upon an inspection or investigation, the Director of Safety or his Compliance Inspector(s), finds that any workplace is not in compliance with any standard, rule, regulation or order, and said official is unable to effect a voluntary agreement to bring the workplace into compliance, he shall, with reasonable promptness, issue to the administrative officer responsible for the workplace a written citation that states the nature and location of the violation; the standard, rule, regulation or order violated; the abatement and correction requirements; and a period of time during which the workplace must accomplish such abatement and correction. A copy of each citation shall immediately be posted at or near each location referred to in the citation and remain posted until the alleged violation has been corrected or vacated.

B. At any time with ten (10) days after receipt of such citation, anyone affected may advise the Director of Safety of objections to the terms and conditions of the citation. Upon receipt of such objections a hearing shall be held, and the Director shall thereafter issue an order affirming, modifying, or vacating the citation and such order shall be final.

XIII. PENALTIES

A. The County shall not issue any civil or criminal penalties against any official, employee, or any other person, or agency for failure to comply with the safety and health standards.

B. Any employee who willfully and repeatedly violates or causes to be violated a safety standard, rule, regulation, or order shall be subject to disciplinary action by the appointing authority. The appointing authority has the power to administer discipline and it shall be his duty to take action in one of the following ways:

- C. The employee being disciplined for violation of Occupational, Safety, and Health Standards shall have the right of appeal to the Director of Safety within ten days after receiving notice of the disciplinary action; and a hearing shall be held as set forth in Section B of the immediately preceding subsection entitled, "Order of Abatement."

XIV. RECORDKEEPING AND REPORTING

- A. The record keeping system for Lawrence County will be one that is required by the Tennessee Department of Labor and kept on their forms. The record-keeping procedures will be those as required in the Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health Public Sector Plan, February 1974, Appendix 6 and/or as amended by the Tennessee Department of Labor.
- B. The position responsible for record keeping is the office of Director of Safety. A flow chart showing how Occupational Injuries and Illnesses will be processed is shown in Table I.

XV. CONFIDENTIALITY OF TRADE SECRETS OR PRIVILEGED INFORMATION

- A. Compliance with any other law, statute or county resolution which regulates safety and health in employment and places of employment shall not excuse the County or any County employee or any other person from compliance with the provisions of this program.
- B. Compliance with any provisions of this program or any standard or regulations promulgated pursuant to this program shall not excuse the County from compliance with any state law or county resolution regulating and promoting safety and health, unless such law or resolution is specifically repealed.



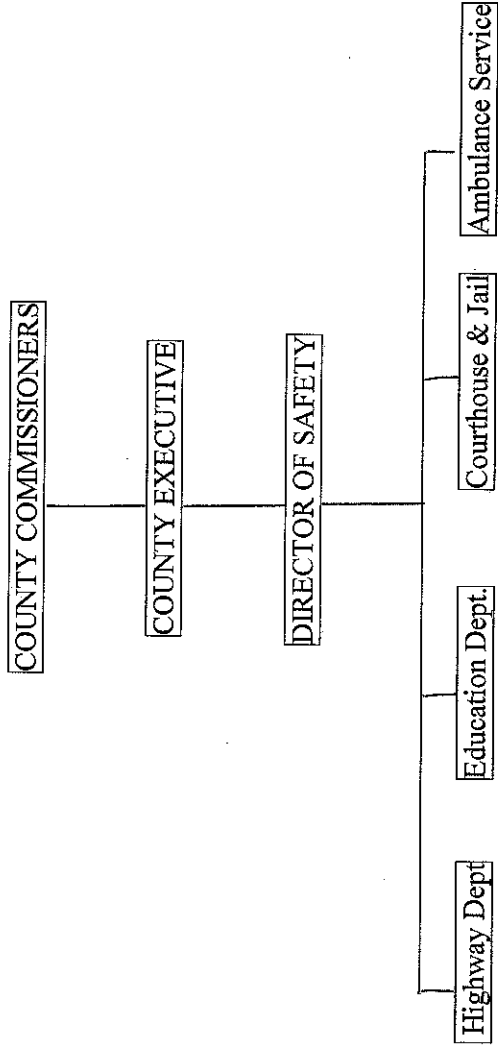

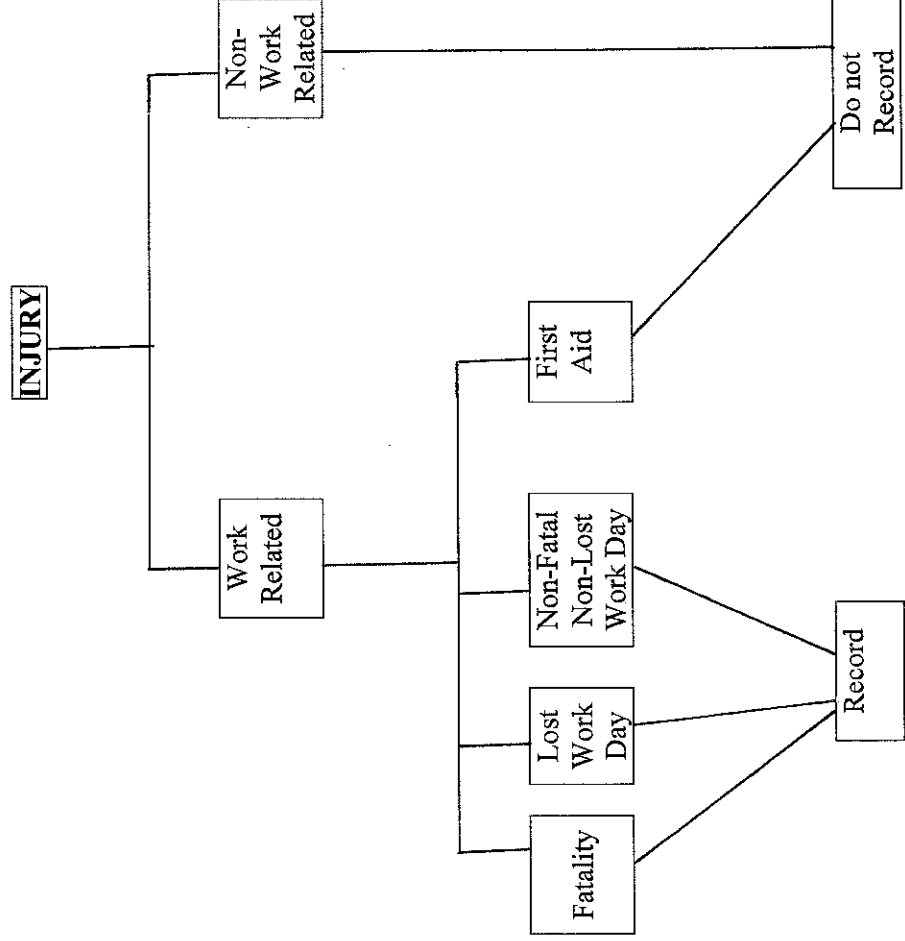

**AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LAWRENCE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION
AND THE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY OF LAWRENCE COUNTY TO ENTER
INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR THE JOINT AND COOPERATIVE MAINTENANCE
OF THE LAWRENCE COUNTY SCHOOLS.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. The Lawrence County Board of Education (the "Board") and the county legislative body of Lawrence County, known as the Lawrence County Commission (the "Commission"), are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into an agreement for the joint and cooperative maintenance of the Lawrence County schools, upon such terms and conditions as may be determined by the Board and the Commission which are not inconsistent with general law. Said agreement shall not exceed four (4) years in duration, and may be renewed.

SECTION 2. The agreement shall contain provisions for allocating expenditures of local funds for school maintenance purposes in such a manner as will allow a determination to be made that the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated §49-2-203(a)(1)(A)(ii) and 49-3-314(c)(3)(A) have not been violated. The method of allocation of funds set out in the agreement shall be used for the purpose of determining that the requirements of Tennessee Code Annotated §49-2-203(a)(1)(A)(ii) and 49-3-314(c)(3)(A) have been met.

SECTION 3. This Act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of Lawrence County. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the county legislative body of Lawrence County and certified to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 4. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 3.
