FOREWORD

The process referred to as Economic Development is neither simple nor is it easy. Economic Development requires an understanding of economic conditions both global and local. It requires a strong network of economic development professionals and the ability to develop relationships within the economic development community. The process further requires a long-term public and private community commitment to the application of the economic development discipline.

OVERCOMING OBSTACLES, EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES

Since its creation in 1817 from Hickman county and Indian Lands, Lawrence County has demonstrated a diverse economy. Lawrenceburg, in the center of the county, was chosen as county seat in 1819. Since the beginning, agriculture, manufacturing, and tourism have served to provide strong economic support. Still today this very diverse economy serves its citizens well. The migration of an Amish community to Lawrence County in 1944 added another dimension to the economic base of the county.

Lawrence County's transition from a primarily agricultural economy to manufacturing began when Murray moved operations from Cleveland, Ohio to Lawrenceburg in 1956. Another wave of manufacturers relocated and/or expanded into Lawrence County during the 1970s. In the last two decades a distinct movement to regional, national, and global competition has occurred. This competition has developed for

markets, jobs, and the total economic process. This change is affecting all sectors of the economy.

Whether it is reflected in agriculture, manufacturing, or tourism the effects are felt in small communities across America. The communities that develop effective programs and processes to deal with these changes will enjoy the most success in the coming decades. The decisions will not only affect today's workforce but the workforce of the future.

How communities develop and deploy their resources will be critical to the long-term economic success of the community. It is therefore incumbent on communities to prepare for the struggle that is present today, a struggle that could be more forceful in the years to come.

Whether it's an excellent workforce, a diverse industrial base, a strong agriculture environment, or a unique tourism development opportunity, the challenge is to develop all these attributes in order to create more and better jobs, thus raising the standard of living for Lawrence County citizens. 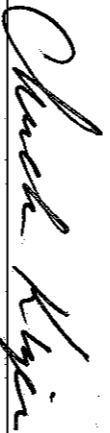

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE ROUNDING OF PENALTY AND INTEREST ON
DELINQUENT PROPERTY TAX AMOUNTS TO THE NEAREST DOLLAR

WHEREAS, T.C.A. §67-5-102(a)(1), authorizes counties to levy an ad valorem tax upon all property subject to such tax; and

WHEREAS, T.C.A. §67-5-102(a)(2), directs that the amount of such tax shall be fixed by the county legislative body of each county; and


WHEREAS, T.C.A. §67-5-2010 is a penalty of one-half of one per cent (0.5%) and interest of one per cent (1%) to be added on March 1 following the tax due date and on the first day of each succeeding month; and

WHEREAS, the rounding of the aforementioned penalty and interest amounts to the nearest dollar would simplify and expedite the payment and collection of delinquent property taxes in the county; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Lawrence County legislative body meeting in regular session this 25th day of July, 2006, the commission directs that the penalty and interest amounts added to delinquent taxes be rounded to the nearest dollar. Such rounding shall be applied uniformly to all delinquent property taxes in the county for real and personal property, and shall be accomplished by rounding amounts ending in \$0.01 to \$0.49 down to the nearest dollar and amounts ending in \$0.50 to \$0.99 up to the nearest dollar.

RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO BE PAID FROM LAWRENCE COUNTY TAX REVENUES TO LOW-INCOME ELDERLY TAXPAYERS, TOTALLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED HOMEOWNERS, AND DISABLED VETERANS IN ADDITION TO THE TAX RELIEF ALREADY PROVIDED BY THE STATE OF TENNESSEE AS PROVIDED BY T.C.A. §67-5-701, *ET SEQ.*

WHEREAS, a need exists in Lawrence County to provide financial assistance to low-income elderly residents of the county; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to T.C.A. §5-9-112, counties are authorized to appropriate funds on an annual basis for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to T.C.A. §5-9-112, the county legislative body is authorized to develop guidelines for eligibility and participation in applying for this assistance;

WHEREAS, pursuant to T.C.A. §67-5-701, the legislative bodies of counties may provide for the appropriation of funds for tax relief for elderly low-income homeowners as described in T.C.A. §67-5-702, for disabled homeowners as described in T.C.A. §67-5-703 and for disabled veterans as described in T.C.A. §67-5-704.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Lawrence County legislative body meeting in regular session this 25th day of July, 2006, that:

SECTION 1. A low-income *ad valorem* real property taxpayer who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older and who resides in Lawrence County shall be eligible to apply for financial assistance based on the amount of real property taxes assessed and levied by the county. The amount shall be equal to the tax relief granted to the taxpayer by the State of Tennessee under T.C.A. §67-5-702, and eligibility shall be determined by the standards and conditions set out in that section.

SECTION 2. A totally and permanently disabled homeowner and who resides in Lawrence County shall be eligible to apply for financial assistance based upon the amount of real property taxes assessed and levied by the county. The amount shall be equal to the tax relief granted to the taxpayer by the State of Tennessee under T.C.A. §67-5-703, and eligibility shall be determined by the standards and conditions set out in that section.

SECTION 3. A disabled veteran real property taxpayer who resides in Lawrence County shall be eligible to apply for financial assistance based upon the amount of real property taxes assessed and levied by the county. The amount shall be equal to the tax relief granted to the taxpayer by the State of Tennessee under T.C.A. §67-5-704, and eligibility shall be determined by the standards and conditions set out in that section.

SECTION 4. Property tax relief shall be obtainable by application to the county trustee. The procedure shall conform to the requirements for state relief as stated in T.C.A. §§67-5-701, 67-5-702, 67-5-703 and 67-5-704, as applicable. After application is made, the trustee shall certify the amount of the relief to the county executive, who shall issue a warrant for the specified amount.

SECTION 5. The assistance set out herein is applicable solely for taxes levied and assessed for the 2006 calendar year. Eligible taxpayers must apply for the assistance no later than February 28, 2007, or on the date of payment of the 2006 taxes, whichever occurs first. Failure to apply within the prescribed time shall constitute a waiver of all claims for the assistance hereby authorized.

SECTION 6. The implementation of this program is dependent on appropriations to fund it in the general appropriations for the fiscal year 2007-2008, or any supplemental appropriations.

SECTION 7. This resolution shall be effective upon passage, contingent upon funding as provided in Section 4, the public welfare requiring it.
